Q4	Circled (a) 'Your, Your'	[1]
Q5	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● 'Concerned Resident' uses personification ● An example of this is 'The town is crying out' 	[2]
Q6	Any 1 from: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● Simile ● Imagery 	[1]
Q7	Any 1 from: <ul style="list-style-type: none"> ● To persuade people [to join the march/to think about the issue] ● To evoke emotion/engage the reader 	[1] Allow any suitable alternatives
