One benefit of mountain biking identified by both texts is that cycling helps you to stay fit. Text A says 'you can keep fit' and Text C similarly says 'it's a brilliant way of enhancing fitness'.

Another benefit identified by both texts is that mountain biking enables you to see impressive scenery. Text A says that you can 'cycle off-road in stunning countryside' and Text C says you can see 'some wonderful rural landscapes'.
