Dear Ms Novak,

I am writing to discuss the council's plan to renovate the existing football pitches and create two new pitches in the town. After collecting data on the opinions of people who live in the area, I would suggest that you alter your plans.

Firstly, I would like to report my findings surrounding people's feelings about the proposed pitches:

- 68% of people in the town across a range of different age groups reported that they love football.
- 89% of people think that football is a good activity to promote health and fitness.
- 77% of people think that football is a good way to encourage teamwork and improve social skills.

However, many townspeople think that new pitches are unnecessary. This is possibly due to the high population of elderly people in the area; they would be unlikely to use the pitches. There are also concerns about noise, litter, and the reduction of space in the local park, where many townspeople like to go for walks and picnics.

Although the existing pitches are in dire need of renovation, creating two new pitches would be an unnecessary expense once the improvements have been made. I suggest that the remaining money would be better spent on improving the accessibility of the park. Several potholes have developed on the paths, making it more difficult for wheelchair users and those with pushchairs to navigate the park. Additionally, the pond has become very overgrown, making it difficult for people to appreciate the local wildlife. Solving these issues would benefit everyone immensely.

I hope that you will take my suggestions and research into consideration.


