What Will You Need to Bring With You?


- Art supplies (only ones that are easy to carry please!) These might include: pencils, charcoal, pen and

The Journey:

Then, once we'd FINALLY sorted our rooms, we marched off into Rome to pursue adventure. We went on a fascinating walking tour and took group photos next to the famous Trevi Fountain.

Our First Day:

We took a tour around the Colosseum. If you don't know what this is, imagine an ancient, crumbling, 2000-year-old stadium, made from highly sculpted stone, which captures the warmth of the Italian sun. The tour guide told us that the amphitheatre was the largest ever built (four levels in some places) and held 50,000 people! We then took photos as the architecture links to our "ancient worlds" art project. Many of us also bought close-up images of sections of sculpted stonework so we can practise sketching.





Day Two:

On the second day, we visited several fascinating museums, monuments and other buildings. All of us loved the beauty of the artwork and gloriously grand architecture. This was the most useful part of the whole trip as we all came away inspired for our projects. We had time to take photographs or sketch our favourite paintings, statues or buildings.

For the final day, we went to Rome's catacombs – these are creepy tunnels and chambers that run under the streets of the busy city. We enjoyed ourselves playing hide and seek in the dark.
