Source A - factsheet about being a travel agent



Your duties: One of your main roles as a travel agent is to give well-informed advice to clients about where and when to travel, based on their needs.

Other duties will include:

- arranging flights, insurance and rooms
- dealing with payments
- advising clients on travel arrangements, eg visas and passports
- sending out tickets to clients
- dealing with complaints or refunds.

Where you will work: Most travel agents are based in branches on the high street, although some work in call centres. Branch travel agents usually work regular hours, 9am - 5pm, 35-40 hours per week, including Saturday. Travel agents starting out can expect to earn around £12,000. More experienced travel agents can earn anything up to £30,000.

You don't need any specific qualifications to become a travel agent. However, some of these qualifications will boost your CV:

- NVQ Levels 2 and 3 in Travel and Tourism
- BTEC HNC/HND in Travel and Tourism Management
- BA Hons in Travel and Tourism.

Travel agents need to have good customer service skills and a friendly manner. A knowledge of another language is always an advantage when working in the travel industry.

Source B - interview with a travel agent

Gemma Antrobus is the senior travel agent at Haslemere Travel. She has been working as a travel agent for 10 years and talked to us about what it is like.

We asked her "What are the good points?"

Gemma said, "There's lots of job satisfaction. You will never become a millionaire as a travel agent, but occasionally you get to live like one. You get a chance to travel the world and visit amazing places. I have been all over the world – America, Australia, Africa ..."

Then we asked her "What are the bad points?"

She laughed. "Dealing with events beyond our control, such as flight delays. These make people very cross, because they lose part of their holiday, and they take it out on us. Clients who pick your brains and then book the holiday themselves to save a few pounds are frustrating too. But even the bad days can be good fun!"
