

INDEPENDENT NEWS CARD THEFT CRIME SOARS

Bank card theft has increased over the past year and is greater now in this city than it has been before. According to police, offences of this type continue to soar daily. This is an especially annoying crime as it frequently leaves people with little money or method of payment. Cards must be cancelled and replaced, and this takes time. Once the bank has been given notice they can address the issue and guide you through the next steps.

We condemn this crime and this leaflet ought to help you if you experience this particular situation yourself.

Here's what you need to do if you find yourself in this difficult position.

1. Call your bank and cancel your card.

An operator will ask various questions to confirm your identity. The bank will then apply a block to payments and you will receive a replacement card. Any money taken illegally will be repaid by the bank. Their guarantee to do this will offer you peace of mind. 2. Ring the police and report that your cards have been stolen.

They will give you a crime number. Although they might not be able to return your property, reporting the theft does increase the chance of it being returned.

3. Keep a regular eye on your bank statement following the theft.

You need to make sure you watch for any unusual or irregular activity taking place.
