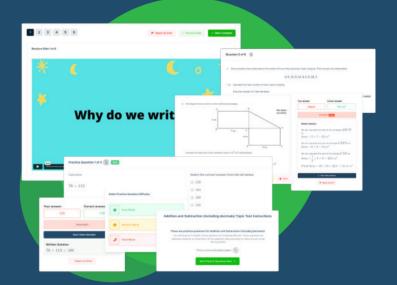

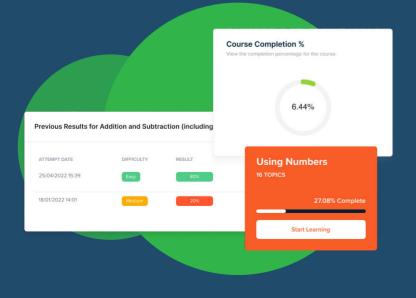

Document 1 suggests that 'politicians are not doing enough to tackle pollution', suggesting that the government should do more to solve the problem of plastic waste. In contrast, Document 2 suggests that individuals should be responsible for solving the plastic problem, as 'it is our responsibility to make changes'.

Give one similarity or difference in the way language is used to convey the views in Documents 1 and 2. Support your answer with evidence from **each** document.

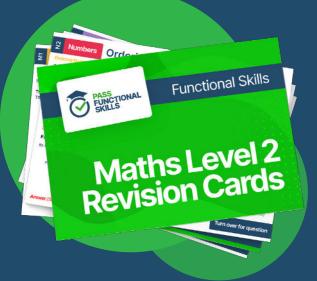
The writer of Document 1 uses rhetorical questions such as 'why can't we do it immediately' to persuade the reader to agree with their views, whilst the writer of Document 2 uses direct address and imperatives like 'go plastic free!'.
