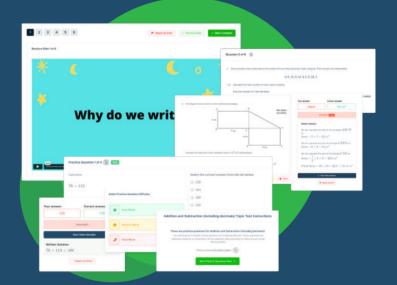

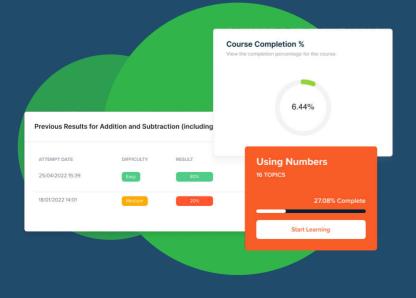

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# Sample Answer - Pass

The recent speeds of cars and motorbikes around the local primary schools are reaching dangerous levels to such an extent that this report is vitally needed.

### PTA concerns

Parents are concerned that their children are at risk of getting hurt or seriously injured by the speeds reached. The high noise pollution levels, caused by such large amounts of revving engines, are disruptive to the children's education, particularly those in Year 1 as their classrooms have windows backing onto the road.

For example, at break times or home times, many parents are unable to park close to the school because of the inconsiderate parking of multiple cars in disabled spots, parent and child spots or on double yellow lines.

Teachers have noted that, at break and lunch times, motorists continually ignore signs warning of the presence of school children and speed past the school, creating a high risk environment for the children.

Cyclists are an additional issue, ignoring road signs to remain off the pavement and therefore, putting more children at risk at peak times. In one case, a teacher was hit by a cyclist on the pavement and stumbled into the road, not only putting herself at risk but also putting the children in their care at risk as they could not be properly supervised.

### PTA recommendations

We recommend the council install 3 speed cameras around the school and surrounding area as more of an incentive for motorists to slow down near the school as current signs appear to be **inconsequential**.

Furthermore, we also recommend additional signs, alerting cyclists that they are passing through a school area and to remain off the pavement, are installed as well as encouragement to wear high visibility clothing.

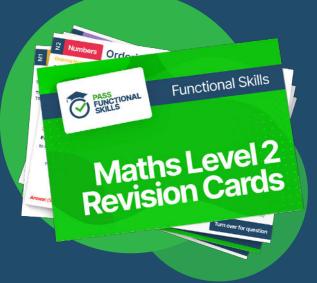
