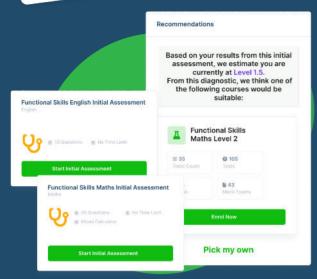

Listing in phrases such as 'cars parked in trees; wide-eyed; hippie healers; crystal massages' creates a detailed image and emphasises the number of sights at the festival.

The sibilance used in 'spectacle of sculpted metal animals' draws attention to the metal sculptures to make them more vivid and memorable for the reader.



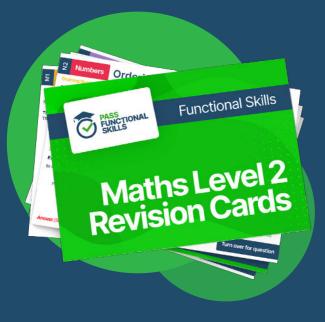
