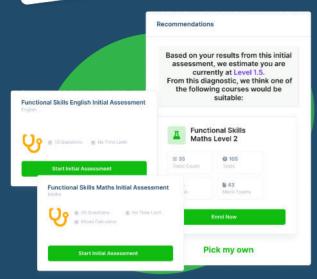

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

All in all, I would still recommend making the trip to Wildwood. Despite the basic food options, I thought that the park had lots of fun activities on offer.



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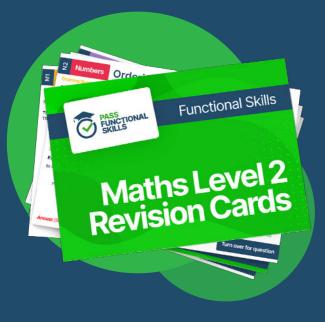








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
