Sample Answer**

Question 1

You have a job working on a youth magazine. You have to write an article based on the title *One thing I would change in this world*.

It might be:

- a specific event in history
- something that is likely to occur in the future
- the invention of a machine or piece of technology
- something more personal to you.

Your task: write the article. You should include:

- explain what you would change
- why do you want to change it?
- how would your life be different?
- how would the world be different?

One thing I would change in this world

When I was ten, my family and I went on holiday to Romania to visit my grandparents. I was so young then that I didn't really understand where I was, or even the fact that I came from a different country to all my friends back in Liverpool. The only thing I really remember was the heat of the metro that seemed to make the air feel **thick**.

On one occasion, when we climbed out of the metro, I was met by the familiar cool breeze and a man standing by the entrance holding a water tank. He held a sign that I couldn't read and looked at everyone who came out of the station as if he knew them. Inside his tank were dozens of turtles **no bigger than a two pound coin**. I pulled my dad's sleeve and asked him if we could take one of them home with us. I figured that they were so small that I could carry it back on the plane in my pocket. **Of course, he said no, and I didn't understand why.**

Since then, I have often thought about what happened to those turtles, about who bought them and what their lives are like. If I had the power to go back and change anything, I would make it so that I could have rescued one of those turtles.

I have always been comforted by reptiles in a way that I never did with cats or dogs. I think that I enjoy how calm they are, and a little turtle would have helped me during all of the stresses I went through in high school. I would have made sure that they had the best life they possibly could have. **Changing this wouldn't have prevented any natural disasters, nor cured a serious disease**, but this is something that I had the power to change and wasn't able to.

Examiner comments

- The writer organises their text using a title and well-structured paragraphs
- Descriptive language and metaphors help to show why this specific event was so important to the writer that they would want to go back and change it (describing the air as 'thick' and describing the turtles as 'no bigger than a two pound coin')
- Time markers help the reader to understand when things happen in the story and make the text flow better ('When I was ten', 'On one occasion', 'Since then')



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Question 2

You are fed up with all the litter you see in your area and have an idea about organising a sponsored litter pick to solve the problem and to raise money for charity.

Your task: write an email to your friend, explaining your idea and asking for her help in organising the event.

You should cover the following:

- what the problem is
- why it would be better if the problem was dealt with
- what your idea is and how it would work on the day
- the charity you would like to help
- what you would like your friend to do to help organise the day.
