Q2	In the question and answer section following your presentation to the group, you are asked, "What could be improved about the products suggested?"	
	Your answer is: 'Ermm I'm not really sure, I guess one could be cheaper than the other?'	
	What is <b>wrong</b> with this answer?

Q3	A learner begins their presentation by saying: 'I will be arguing that there are many good reasons to take the visitors to a museum. Most importantly, it's a cheap and interesting day out, as entry is free and a coffee at the cafe only costs £1.50'.	
	What has this learner <b>done well</b> ?

Q4	Why is it important to contribute <b>more than once</b> during the <b>discussion</b> ?
